Activities:

- 1.) Watch this video and practice other rhyming words
- 2.) Rhyming contest. Practice making rhymes with the whole family!
 - 1. pick a word with many rhyming matches
 - 2. Go in a circle to name something that rhymes with that word
 - 3. First person that can't think of a rhyme is out!!
 - 4. Can be done with silly words or real words, depending on the abilities of your kid!
- 3.) Coloring/Activity Pages (<u>Download Here</u>)
- 4.) *Math*

Materials:

- paper, felt, tissues, or any material that can be cut or formed into shapes (string, playdough, or tin foil could work too!)
- scissors

Help your child explore shapes! Ask them to create squares, circles, rectangles, and triangles with any material you may find. They can practice drawing them first, or if needed, draw a shape which they may cut along. Challenge them to make a shape with a bit of yarn, and get creative with the materials you use!



Alternatively, if you'd rather have your child up and moving, ask them to find shapes throughout your house! Find examples of circles (jar, mug, candle), squares (tissue box, mirror, cabinets), and any others you may have.

Work on puzzles with your child, practice counting, and if you're getting tired of the same old puzzles or activities, there are tons available online as well!
